We also have several manufacturing and broadcasting contracts coming due this calendar year. The remainder of 2021 will have a heavy focus on contract negotiations. Local 292 will continue working to negotiate the best possible collective bargaining agreements for our members. Our intent is to bring forward tentative agreements that are fair and equitable when we get them in front of members for ratification votes.

Local 292 is just over one year into the occupancy of our new home. We look forward to seeing you all in person as COVID-19 guidelines relax. At this point, we are planning for our annual golf outing and picnic, and we are planning on conducting in-person general membership meetings going forward. Please attend these events and participate in the Local as we bring back our in-person membership meetings. We are only as strong as our members who participate.

The past 12 months have been challenging for all of us. Now it is time to unite and bring our Local union forward. We can only do that together. I look forward to seeing you all as we move out of this horrific period and into the future.

Safety Corner **BIGGEST ISSUE ON JOBSITES** TODAY: COMMUNICATION

It's been a difficult year for all of us. Unfortunately, for some of us, the consequences of pandemic-related changes, work-relate stresses and other emotionally significant factors have brought an unexpectedly large toll on our lives. We have seen some significant injuries and deaths come across the table at the safety committee. For me, it highlights the need to become even more vigilant and change

the way we do "business as usual."

While most of us feel like we know what shortcuts are acceptable to take—or maybe even expected to take, from a contractor's view—that thought process creates some issues. Let me explain: every day, we work with others around us who do not share the same knowledge and experience we do. For example, maybe a crew gets used to doing things a certain way, even though

it doesn't follow procedure. When you introduce a new member to the crew, they will default to the training they have, but the rest of the crew will default to their learned behavior (the shortcut). This may or may not cause a safety situation.

This brings up one of the biggest issues on jobsites today: COMMUNICATION! The majority of issues, safety or otherwise, can be traced back to a breakdown in communication. So please, take the time to talk things through. Use active listening to repeat back instructions in different words to be sure both parties understand what was intended to be said. Don't be surprised if what you heard isn't quite what was meant. Communication also plays a role in creating a healthy work environment. We need to be talking to each other and checking in on each other as we go through the day. If someone is having trouble at home, or is feeling harassed at work, or maybe just needs to tell someone about a concern they have, we need to be able to stop and listen to what they have to say. If we can't take the time to listen, we'll never know what we needed to hear.

IBEW VETERANS Committee - LOCAL 292

I am pleased to announce that the Minneapolis JATC has hired the first veteran through the Veteran Electrical Entry Program (VEEP). The JATC is expecting to hire another veteran through VEEP soon.

The Veterans Committee is working together with the Benefits Office to help streamline the paperwork that needs to be done for pre- and post-deployments for our military members. The guidebook is in the works.

Many Reserve and Guard members in our Local are unaware of the importance of filing the proper paperwork with the Benefits Office and their employer before and after deployments. This includes freezing your Local 292 healthcare benefits when deployed for 31 days or more and getting your family on Tricare before you leave.



What will happen if you do not freeze your Local 292 benefits? Well, you could be expected to pay for those benefits, and you could lose healthcare credits while you are away. This is avoidable if you reach out to the Veterans Committee. Too many military members are not informed by their command of how to properly prepare for deployments. The Veterans Committee can help, so please send us an email.

Lastly, I would like to let the membership know that if you have a loved one or friend who is a veteran and who has passed away, there is a list of benefits that survivors are entitled to when a veteran dies. Each case is different according to what disability benefits they are receiving before they die. The Veterans Committee can answer most questions about death and survivor benefits without having to contact Veterans Affairs. Again, the Veterans Committee can help, so please contact us.

The Veterans Committee now has our own "Service Officer" named Jeff Jarosz. He is a benefits specialist and can help with these things.

The purpose of our great JATC has always been to train our apprentices to be, at a minimum, the best journey-level workers in the industry, and we are seeing that success with another great passing rate on the state exam. We look forward to next fall with the school being open with no restrictions and classes resuming back to normal.

With the onset of summer, and no classes in the building, we are updating our 20-year-old building. We will be replacing much of the flooring in the hallways and the classrooms. We will also be replacing the rooftop units and the building automation system. Thank you all for your support of the JATC.

We are offering an Electric Vehicle class in July for the EVITP certification in anticipation of more electric vehicle charging
