From the Business Manager's Perspective

IBEW CONVENTION, SUMMER WORK PICTURE, AND POLITICS

The 40th IBEW Convention has come and gone. Contractors are optimistic about the summer work picture and we, as workers in the organized labor movement, have a lot of work to do this fall to ensure that labor-friendly politicians are elected to office.

IBEW International Convention

The 40th IBEW International Convention ("IC") was held in Chicago May 9–13, 2022. Originally, the IC was scheduled for Fall of 2021, but it was postponed due to COVID. At the IC, the business of the IBEW is handled by the elected delegates from each Local across the United States and Canada. For those who do not know, Local 292 sent 10 delegates, one alternate delegate, and one member to represent Minnesota on the International RENEW (young workers) committee.

This year's IC featured 31 proposed amendments to the IBEW Constitution and 42 proposed resolutions to be decided. Additionally, for the first time in history, the delegates to the IBEW IC were treated to an appearance from a sitting United States president. President Joe Biden made history when he addressed our delegates at this year's IC.

Topics for discussion at the IC included diversity, inclusion, NEBF, PBF, safety, classifications, and membership dues, among other things. Your delegation from Local 292 carried your voice to the convention on all these issues. Although I did not vote in favor of all the amendments and resolutions that passed, the democratic process prevailed, and we will soon have a new set of rules governing our business in the IBEW.

Summer Work Picture

Unfortunately, the work picture in our area remains slow. However, in my discussions with our employers, I have noticed that the employers are far more optimistic about the work picture this year than they were last year. I know it is frustrating waiting for a job call and the optimism of our contractors is of little consolation. Delayed job starts and supply chain issues will likely plague the near future in our industry, but hopefully we will pull out of this slump soon. Thankfully, there are Locals nearby where our members can go find gainful employment. I want to thank all the local unions that are currently employing 292 members; I hope we can repay this favor soon.

Politics

Everyone's favorite subject, I know! Politics are not the favorite topic of conversation for many people, but the reality is, politics affect our lives every day. Elections can and do have consequences and we, as a labor movement, must stay engaged in the political arena. We must support

Safety Corner BRING THE HEAT

This summer we would like for you to "BRING THE HEAT" to the forefront of your safety culture. Heat exhaustion, heat cramps, heat rash and heat stroke—whichever it is, it can lead to serious illness or even death.

As employees or employers, it's up to all of us to take the necessary steps to mitigate these hazards while looking out for coworkers and ourselves. Some signs of heat exhaustion include thirst, nausea, irritability, weakness, headaches and dizziness, while the most severe signs are heat stroke–related, such as confusion, collapsing and seizures.

The best way to start protecting ourselves from the heat is to limit our exposure to direct sunlight or hot, humid conditions. Additionally, we can protect ourselves by working in early morning hours or even calling it quits at noon to minimize our time in the heat.

Having plenty of cool water nearby, taking frequent breaks or getting more manpower than usual for a given task can be helpful too.

By taking some of these steps to become more prepared regarding heat stress, we will all help each other have another great summer.

COPE can always be a great resource for you, but this group of dedicated 292 members play an extremely important role for the Local as we near elections.

We have completed another IC and will soon have a new set of governing rules as spelled out in our IBEW Constitution. Although the current work picture remains slow, many contractors I have spoken with are optimistic that 2022 will be a good year. Keep watching the website and job line for work opportunities. I know politics is not everyone's favorite subject, but we must remain involved. Politics affects our lives and our industry. We need to support a political agenda and candidates that support our jobs and our work. Hello Brothers and Sisters of IBEW Local 292

The Minnesota Legislative Session has now come to an end. It was a disappointing session with very little getting done. Legislators began their work this year with a \$7.7 Billion surplus. There were as many ideas on how to use that surplus as there are residents as are in Minnesota. It could've been tax relief, spending on construction projects or providing matching dollars for the Federal Infrastructure plan. NONE of that important work got done. In addition to that surplus, Governor Walz proposed a \$2.7 Billion bonding bill. With interest rates as low as they are, now was the time to borrow money for capital improvement/construction projects; however, a bonding bill did not get done either.

A couple positive items were completed: Legislation providing a bonus for frontline workers and replenishing the unemployment trust fund were finally passed, and we did not see any attacks on the Minnesota Electrical Act that would've affected licensing, reciprocity, inspection, classifications, or apprenticeship ratios.

If we want to see positive outcomes at the Minnesota legislature, we need your help. Please vote for laborendorsed candidates to assure a labor-friendly majority in the Minnesota House and Senate and re-elect Governor Walz to help hold the line against any attacks on working families, labor principles and our electrical licenses and standards.

2022 is an important election year. All Minnesota legislators and constitutional officers, including governor, are up for election this year, as are all our U.S. Congressional Representatives. We will need to start early and work hard to make sure our collective labor voices are heard and to secure a labor-friendly majority at the Minnesota capitol as well as help reelect Tim Walz to another 4-year term as governor. With Tim Walz at the helm of the administration, we have been able to hold back a number of antiworker, anti-electrical-industry legislative attacks. We have been able to garner favorable outcomes for appointments of Department of Labor Commissioner

and committee and board members that have served us well throughout the state and helped our industry.

Without securing a labor-friendly majority and without re-electing Tim Walz, I have no doubt that we will see a steady stream of anti-worker and anti-electrical-industry legislation and administrative action against us, including Right to Work. We DO NOT want to become Wisconsin. Our anti-labor enemies are poised to put us there. If we don't restore a labor-friendly MN legislature and retain our current labor-friendly governor, Minnesota WILL become a Right to Work state!

Please consider getting involved this year more than any other. Please help our labor family gain the recognition and support we need to maintain or improve a great standard of living and respect in the workplace, on the job site, at home, and in our communities, for ourselves and for our families.

I want to let you know of some important events and opportunities coming up this year that you can participate in to help our collective IBEW Local 292 labor voice be heard.

August 9: Statewide Primaries

November 8: Election Day
